


Giant Log Cabin Pattern

Finished size approx. 40" square



This pattern can be made as a quilt top or by the Quilt as you Go method.

Both sets of instructions are included.

Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance throughout, and press seams to the side.

This pattern assumes that you have the basic knowledge for Patchwork and Quilting. Please read through the whole pattern before starting to cut and piece your quilt top.

Fabric requirements:

- One 10½" square for the centre
- One 44" square of backing
- One 44" square of wadding



Fabric strips to cut

| • Fabric A |  | One 5½" x 10½", One 5½" x 15½" |
| • Fabric B |  | One 5½" x 15½", One 5½" x 20½" |
| • Fabric C |  | One 5½" x 20½", One 5½" x 25½" |
| • Fabric D |  | One 5½" x 25½", One 5½" x 30½" |
| • Fabric E |  | One 5½" x 30½", One 5½" x 35½" |
| • Fabric F |  | One 5½" x 35½", One 5½" x 40½" |

Quilt as you Go Method — It is recommended that all sewing is done using a walking foot, so that all layers feed through the machine evenly.

Lay the wadding on top of the backing with the backing right side down.
Fuse or baste in place to stop drift.



Mark the centre of the wadding with a cross, with a marking pen.



Mark the centre point of each side of the 10½” centre square, and lay it right side up on the wadding so that it is central on the creased centre cross of the wadding/backing. Pin in place.

Now lay the smaller strip of fabric A on top of the centre square right sides facing lined up with the right hand edge. Stitch in place through all 4 layers using a ¼” seam.

Then fold the strip back and press in place.



Turn the whole piece 90 degrees Anti-clockwise.
Lay the 2nd piece of fabric A right side down on top of the 2 fabric pieces, lined up with the right hand edges.



Stitch in place through all 4 layers using a ¼” seam.

Then fold the strip back and press in place.

Turn the whole piece 90 degrees Anti-clockwise.
Lay the smaller piece of fabric B right side down on top of the 3 fabric pieces, lined up with the right hand edges.

Stitch in place through all 4 layers using a ¼” seam.

Then fold the strip back and press in place.



Turn the whole piece 90 degrees Anti-clockwise again.
Lay the 2nd piece of fabric B right side down on top of the 4 fabric pieces, lined up with the right hand edges.

Stitch in place through all 4 layers using a ¼” seam.


Then fold the strip back and press in place.

Continue like this turning the quilt and adding the next piece, moving through the pieces in alphabetical and size order, until you have added all of the strips.

Trim the wadding and backing to the size of the top.

Cut Four 2½” x WOF strips of fabric for the binding and join by your preferred method.

Traditional Quilt Top method





Take the 10½” centre square and place the smallest Fabric A strip on top, right sides together, lined up with the right hand top corner.

Sew together with a ¼” seam. Open out and press the seam towards the piece just added.

Turn the whole piece 90 degrees Anti-clockwise.

Lay the 2nd piece of fabric A right side down on top of the 2 fabric pieces, lined up with the right hand top corner.

Sew together with a ¼” seam. Open out and press the seam towards the piece just added.



Turn the whole piece 90 degrees Anti-clockwise.


Lay the smaller piece of fabric B right side down on top of the 3 fabric pieces, lined up with the right hand top corner.

Sew together with a ¼” seam. Open out and press the seam towards the piece just added.

Turn the whole piece 90 degrees Anti-clockwise again.

Lay the 2nd piece of fabric B right side down on top of the 4 fabric pieces, lined up with the right hand top corner.

Sew together with a ¼” seam. Open out and press the seam towards the piece just added.



Continue like this turning the quilt and adding the next piece, moving through the pieces in alphabetical and size order, until you have added all of the strips.

Layer the quilt top with wadding and backing and quilt as desired.
Trim the backing and wadding to the size of the top.

Cut Four 2½” x WOF strips of fabric for the binding and join by your preferred method, all the way around the quilt.
